



Cross-Border Investigative Journalism Training for the Western Balkans

The Center for Media, Data, and Society at the Central European University in Budapest is announcing an open call for

**journalists in Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Kosovo,
North Macedonia, Montenegro and Serbia**

with some experience in news reporting and covering complex topics to apply for a unique hybrid-style online and offline course on cross-border investigative journalism.

The course will start with an intensive two-day training in Budapest, Hungary, on October 19-21, 2020, followed by eight weeks of online instruction.

THE COURSE IS FREE.

Accommodation and travel costs related to the Budapest training will be covered by the program.



"Issues investigative journalists cover do not stop at the borders, so why should reporters? Large scale cross-border investigations proved the enormous value of journalistic collaborations when covering trans-national issues. Investigative reporting of this kind, however, requires journalists, traditionally more lone wolves than team players, to acquire specific skills, capacities, mindset and the know-how of various digital tools."
